# Job Hunting for the Summer?

Everyone wants the cool summer job, the one with decent pay, great hours, and fun co-workers. But it's more elusive than ever. It's getting harder for teens to find summer work, according to one research study, with just over a third of teens working the past two summers, the lowest rate in 56 years. How come? There's more competition for jobs from older workers as well as fewer subsidized government job programs for teens at the local, state, and national levels.

Don't give up. Just count on working to find work. Traditionally, seasonal attractions such as swimming pools, golf courses, theme parks, zoos, ballparks, resorts, and marinas need help during the summer months, so it's still worth checking them out. Many people will need help with lawn mowing, gardening, farm work, cleaning projects, and daycare, too. Other opportunities include filling in for people on vacation, setting up home computer or entertainment systems, or working on home improvement projects. Don't forget to use the Web for your search, too. There are many sites specifically devoted to jobs for teens. Be sure to check with your parents before agreeing to work.

Here is a list of the Top 10 most employed summer jobs - not in any order.

1. **Farm work.** Work outdoors planting, cultivating, or harvesting crops. Sell fruits and vegetables at farmer's markets.
2. **Attractions.** Many need extra help during tourist season.
3. **Lifeguard.** Strong swimmers who can be certified as a lifeguard can spend the summer at the poolside or the beach.
4. **Mother's helper.** With younger kids out of school, many families need a responsible older kid to keep an eye on them. Often, certification courses are open to kids aged 11 and older.
5. **Pet sitting.** Many vacationing families need their pets cared for while they're away.
6. **Painting and construction.** Contractors need an extra hand during the summer.
7. **Tutor.** Put your math or word skills to work helping others learn.
8. **Yard work.** Help homeowners keep up with the lawn, garden, and hedge trimming.
9. **Ice cream shop or fast food outlets.** Other restaurants also may have seasonal needs for staff.
10. **Country club or park and recreation departments.** Many hire youth workers for the summer.

# MEMORIAL DAY

May 30, 2011

On Monday, May 30th celebrate Memorial Day by remembering those that lost their lives serving this great country. Did you know that in 1966, the federal government, under the direction of President Lyndon Johnson, declared Waterloo, N.Y., the official birthplace of Memorial Day? They chose Waterloo—which had first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866—because the town had made Memorial Day an annual, community-wide event during which businesses closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags. Today, Memorial Day is celebrated at Arlington National Cemetery with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. Also, it is customary for the president or vice-president to give a speech honoring the contributions of the fallen and lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
